St Andrew's is sponsoring a child's education



After research, discussion, prayer and thought, the PCC decided to sponsor the education of a child through the charitable organisation DFN. The charity aims to help the poor, marginalised and outcasts in South Asia transition to live in dignity and freedom. Their programmes are designed, led and staffed by nationals using a holistic approach covering the four key areas of education, healthcare, economic empowerment and community development.

St Andrew's is sponsoring the education of a girl called Sanjana Jarupula who is 12 years old and lives in Papaiahpet in India. We will get regular updates on her progress at school.

Sanjana's father works as a mason in construction sites and her mother works as a labourer for daily wages. Their income is not regular and the family struggles to meet their basic needs. They live on a small house and Sanjana stays with her grandparents who send her to the DFN school.

MMP Lent course – Save the Date




After the success of the MMP Advent course, we are looking forward to another MMP led course for Lent. It will start in the week beginning 19th February.


12.30 to 13.00	Setting up: putting up tables and unloading the van
